Seminar on "Right to Information"

Balaji Law College, Pune, organized a one day Seminar on "Right to Information" on 27th September 2019 at 11.00 am. The core concept of the seminar was to guide students to use Act, understand its nuisance and file their first RTI application. The event was held in collaboration with Money Life Foundation a nonprofit organization which has a Right to Information Centre that works at empowering people about speeding awareness about act. The workshop enlightened that RTI is a powerful tool that help people address issues that affect them or work towards the betterment of society by making public officials accountable. Thus the main objective of the workshop was to make students aware about the salient features of the RTI act 2005, roles and responsibilities and Transparency Officer.

Three sections of the workshop were held from 11 am to 1:15 pm. starting at 8:30 am, workshop registration opened. Last session started at 12.30 pm to 12.50pm by Ms. Vinita Deshnukh, she explained the RTI application format and the format for filing an appeal to the participants the application should be addressed to the right department. If not done, it would create unnecessary delays. The RTI should be sent preferably through Speed Post, as this you get an acknowledgement that the public information officer (PIO) has received it

All the students actively participated in interactions and raised various points which were clarified by the speakers. All the speakers were felicitated with shawl, garland and memento. All the speakers were provided with High class Lunch
