# REPORT ON THREE-DAY WORKSHOP ON NAAC PEER TEAM VISIT GUIDANCE

A three-day workshop on NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) Peer Team Visit Guidance was organized in Balaji Law College from 14-16 February 2024 to provide comprehensive training and guidance to educational institutions preparing for accreditation assessments. The workshop aimed to enhance understanding, preparedness, and effectiveness in handling the NAAC peer team visits, which are crucial for institutions seeking accreditation. The workshop was conducted under the guidance of esteemed guest speaker, Dr. G.Y. Shitole Sir, who brought invaluable expertise and experience in the field of accreditation.

### Day 1: Teaching Staff Workshop

The workshop commenced with an introduction to the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and the significance of peer team visits in evaluating institutional quality and performance. The focus of the day was to familiarize teaching staff with the NAAC criteria related to teaching-learning processes and evaluation methods.

Sessions and Activities:

Overview of NAAC Criteria: The first session provided an overview of the seven NAAC criteria, with a specific focus on criteria relating to Curricular Aspects and Teaching-Learning and Evaluation. Examples and case studies were presented to illustrate effective teaching practices and assessment methods.
