



Most teachers (53.84%) found the course syllabus to have clear objectives and outcomes, though a substantial portion rated it as good.

4. Sufficiency of Lectures Allotted to the Course:

While most teachers rated this parameter as good (46.15%), 23.07% felt it was merely satisfactory or adequate, indicating a need for review.

5. Availability of Prescribed Books (Text and Reference):

Excellent: 53.84%Good: 15.38%

A majority of teachers (53.84%) found the availability of prescribed books excellent, but nearly one-third (30.76%) highlighted room for improvement.

6. Evaluation Pattern of the Course:

The evaluation pattern was considered definite and sufficient by all respondents, with most (61.53%) rating it as excellent.

7. Institutional Support for Skill Development and Qualification Upgradation:

Teachers widely appreciated the institutional support for skill development, with no negative feedback.

8. Administrative Support:

The highest-rated parameter, administrative support, was deemed excellent by 69.23% of respondents.

9. Support for ICT Facilities:

ICT support was rated as good by a majority (61.53%), reflecting overall satisfaction but potential for enhancement.

Key Insights:

1. Strengths:


- o Administrative support (69.23% excellent).

2. Areas for Improvement:

- o Lecture allotment sufficiency: 23.07% rated as satisfactory or adequate.
- Availability of prescribed books: 30.76% rated as satisfactory.
- o ICT facilities, while generally good, had fewer excellent ratings (38.46%).

Recommendations:

- 1. **Reassess Lecture Allotments:** Evaluate the adequacy of lectures per course and adjust schedules if needed to enhance coverage.
- 2. Improve Library Resources: Address gaps in the availability of prescribed books by expanding the collection of both textbooks and reference materials.
- 3. Enhance ICT Support: Invest in upgrading ICT infrastructure and provide training to maximize utility.



Conclusion:

The overall feedback indicates that the institution is performing well in most areas, particularly in providing administrative and professional support. Addressing the identified areas for improvement can further enhance the academic experience for both faculty and students.

- A majority of students rated the curriculum and syllabus as Good (30) and Excellent (25).
- The syllabus providing sufficient elective options received a mixed response, with a significant portion marking it as **Good** (30).
- While 24 students rated the specification of course objectives as Excellent, 26 rated it Satisfactory.
- The effectiveness of attaining course objectives was largely seen as Good (30).
- There is room for improvement in how the syllabus facilitates professional skill development, with only 21 marking it as **Excellent**.

- Hostel Facility and Career Guidance and Placement were areas of concern, receiving the highest number of Adequate ratings (26 and 28, respectively).


Summary of Key Areas for Improvement:

Outcome:



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR FACULTY EXCHANGE

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into on 12/9/2023 between Sri Balaji Society's Balaji w College located at 55/2-7, Tathwade, Opposite Mumbai Bengaluru Highway, Off, Old Mumbai Rd, Pimpri-Chinchwad, Maharashtra 411033, hereinafter referred to as "Party A" and SNBP Law College, located at Morwadi, Pimpri, Pune - 411018, hereinafter referred to as "Party B."

Preamble: Recognizing the importance of academic collaboration and the benefits of Faculty Exchange in promoting academic and cultural understanding between our institutions, Party A and Party B hereby agree to establish a Faculty Exchange Program based on the following terms and conditions.

Article 1: Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to promote academic collaboration, research cooperation and faculty development between Party A and Party B.

Article 2: Faculty Exchange Program

- 1. Both parties agree to establish a faculty exchange program that will enable the exchange of teaching and research staff between their respective institutions.
- 2. Faculty members eligible for the exchange program shall be selected based on their academic qualifications, research expertise and willingness to participate in the exchange.

Article 3: Duration of Exchange

The duration of faculty exchange visits shall be determined on a case by case basis. Exchange periods can vary from one day to one week, subject to mutual agreement between the parties involved.

Article 4: Financial Provisions

Neither Party A nor Party B shall charge faculty exchange fees to the visiting faculty members during their exchange period.
